WHAT IS H.O.P.E.?

H.O.P.E. is a group of caring and concerned members of our community who are willing to help others. All of us could be faced with challenges and crises at some point in our lives. It is our goal to share our time, talent and resources for the good of our friends and neighbors.

WHO IS H.O.P.E.?

H.O.P.E. is a partnership with Kehilat HaNahar, St. Martin of Tours and New Hope Borough.

HOW IS H.O.P.E. ORGANIZED?

There are seven (7) groups of volunteers. Each group serves for one week on a rotating basis. Each group has two co-leaders who take calls during their week and assign the jobs to appropriate volunteers on their list after checking with them on their availability. The volunteer then confirms the details with the person needing service.

Volunteers will be asked to help once every seven (7) weeks.

WHAT DO H.O.P.E. VOLUNTEERS DO?

- ◆ Share our time by making phone calls and house visits with those who are unable to leave their homes.
- ◆ Provide transportation to medical appointments, the bank, the Post Office, the supermarket, etc.
- ◆ Prepare meals on an emergency basis.
- ◆ Go grocery shopping for the homebound.
